DARAH-JHALAWAR HAM PROJECT

Construction of 4-Lane road on NH-12 (New NH-52) from Km. 299.000 to Km. 346.540 (Design Chainage 9.860 to 58.740) (Darah – Jhalawar – Teendhar) in the state of Rajasthan under NHDP Phase-III on HAM having a Length of 48.88 Km on 04 October, 2017 for which construction works were started from 24 May, 2018 onwards and the project was provisionally declared fit for entry into Commercial Operation on 8th June, 2022 and thus became our first ever HAM to be entered in Commercial Operation.

- Due to soil settlement along the slope of the railway line, pushing the RUB box was challenging. Following that, soil improvement techniques like soil nailing and stone piling were used.
- To maintain our project highway within the provided ROW, retaining walls up to 13m height were constructed at locations that were constrained to 45/60m. Construction of the RE wall at ROB Ch 44+158 was a challenging task, for which, 2-tier RE Wall is constructed as per standard guidelines to address the height issue.
- As a result of the Gap slab resting on RE Wall soil at such a great height, extra piers were built inside the RE Wall to protect it. The borrow areas did not meet the requirements for a reinforced fill of RE wall areas, so pond ash was used as Reinforced fill. As a result, we completed our task by transporting pond ash.

Project Alignment Passing through Forest Areas proposes elevating the road to minimize disturbance to wildlife. RUBs have been constructed to minimize railway disruption. ROB, horizontal curves, and proper lighting arrangements have been made to improve visibility at night.

In locations with higher embankments, slope protection and safety are provided. We have also designed the toll administration building, Toll Plaza, and Elevated Cum Major Bridge Structure, in addition to the Major Bridges.

We thank Dr Geetanjali Gupta from Zydus Hospital, Baroda, who carried out the session so gracefully and helped us understand how we can be of help to ourselves and the society at large.



Does Ram killed Ravana on Vijay Dashami and return on Deepawali?

The biggest festival which is celebrated by people across the country is Deepawali which comes after Vijay Dashami and Shakti Parv. If we asked anyone regarding why Vijay Dashami is celebrated the majority of the people will reply that on this days Ram Killed Ravan and for celebrating his victory over evil Ravana effigy is burned as symbolic with great fun and fare.

And if we asked people what happened after that? The people believed that after 20 days Ram returned to Ajodhya where his brother Bharat was waiting to give him back his Kingdom and this day is celebrated as Deepawali.

This is absolutely correct that on return of Ram Ji to Ajodhya, Ramji was coronated. But what was the actual day on which the coronation of Rama took place. The people believe it is same day of Deepawali and in its celebration earthen lamps are lighted and the same is being taught to everyone in schools and everywhere else.

Now the question arises on which days Ram's was given exile? It is general public believe that it is same day of Deepawali as he was to be coronated as king but was given exile. But we have never explored this topic in our book Ramayan to know the actual truth.

It is very clearly written in Ramayana that King Dasharath, after contemplating with his ministerial council and Gurus, had decided to do the coronation of his son in Pushp Nakshatra of Chaitra month.

Accordingly King Dasarath had told Ram that tomorrow in the morning you will be coronated as King in Pushp Nakshatra, but due to Kaikayi in the night the whole scenario changed, he was forced to change his decision and ordered 14 years exile to Ram. The days on which he was supposed to be coronated but was exiled.

During this period Bharat and Shatrudhan were in their Nanihal home. Sita and Lakshman Ji also went with Ram and due to this painful separation, later King Dasharatha gave up his life. The ministers without the king immediately decided to bring the future king Bharat. But Bharat Ji did not accept the Kingdom. Bharat Ji followed Rama in Chitrakoot and tried his best to convinced his brother to returned back to Ayodhya.

Ram was not ready to return back to fulfil his father promise of 14 years. Bharat Ji took a oath from Ram Ji that when 14 years are completed, he will return back to Ajodhya on the same day otherwise I will give up my

life by climbing into a living pyre.

Now Ram has a compulsion, that if he returned one day less in 14 years, then he will break his father order of 14 years' exile and if late by one day then will lose his brother Bharat.

Therefore, Ram reached Ayodhya by plane on the same day when he had completed 14 years i.e. the day he left for exile and so that he neither broke the promise given to his father nor allowed Bharat to die. As said above in past that his coronation was to be held in the Pushp Nakshatra of Chaitra month. The counting of 14 years will start from this day only just as applicable in case of anyone birthday or anniversary will end on the same day and month of Chaitra.

Now instead of the month of Chaitra, if we consider Kartika Amavasya to be the return day of Ram, then our knowledge about culture is very poor. Ramayan is the book which states that Ram went to exile on the fifth day of Chaitra month and returned on the same day. In the present calendar also if see carefully day of Ram coronation is mentioned on Panchami of Chaitra month. We neither look at the calendar correctly nor read Ramayan. Our Knowledge about our culture and tradition are based on heard things and TV serials.

Ravan was killed in the month of Fagun and after his funeral, Vibhishan was coronated as King of Lankha. After that very short span of time was left for Ram to return back to Ajodhya so he took Vibhishana's plane and landed at the Ashram of Sage Bharadwaj 1 day before of completing 14 years near Ajodhya. Through Hanuman Ji Ram informed Bharat about his arrival. The arrival in Ajodhya is the month of Chaitra only.

In fact, in Chaitra and Kuar month, the earth passes twice near the Sun due to which we feel the effect of scorching heat and which causes weakness & disease in our body during this period which affect us. For fighting this weakness and show our dominance over weakness this festival of Shakti Parv is celebrated as inspiration of being one powerfulness.

That is why this festival of Navratri comes twice in a year in which weather condition are similar. During Navratri i.e. Shakti Parv in the month of Ashwin, our great Rishis used to give knowledge of various types of eight powers to be acquired and organizing the eight powers into one, make it the invincible power which is described as superpower.

The power which cannot be defeated by anyone is called Durga Shakti, hence Navami is called Durga Navami and the power acquired gives one eternal Victory which is celebrated as Vijaydashami, it was a

festival in earlier era similar to Republic day today where power and self-defence was shown for establishing Dharam. How should the victory be? For this example of Ram victory over Ravan is given, because his victory was unique as Ram at that time had no support of Ayodhya nor its military assistance. Both brother were alone in Jungle with their Armours and their will to win. He recognized the forest powers and done agreement with them and increased powers to conquered Ravan, the great superpower of that period, under these circumstances, such a victory is really great and unique is given as an example, moreover after demolishing evil rule of Ravan, the law of Vedic Dharam & tradition was established in Lanka through Vibhishan by their own self rule and Ram Ji did not extend his Kingdom.

The victory gives one the wealth, power and prestige which needs to be protected from all enemies. As Amavasya of Kartik (darkest of 12 Amavasya) is the darkest night of the year so the message of spreading light across the world by lighting lamp and turning the blackest night into bright Deepawali is celebrated. Deepawali is celebrated for spreading the message of light i.e. the darkness night that comes from nature is

illuminated by lighting a lamp by our effort. We Sanathanani people believe in our religious slogan "Tama So Ma Jyotirgamaya".

We humans being do not like darkness, then why Dasaratha, who was a Suryavanshi King whose flag include Sun would choose such a darkest night period for his son's coronation? It is established from the above facts that Ravan died in Fagun and Ram returned back in Chaitra.

Our Country was the most powerful and richest in the world and who established the rule of Dharam across the world, but in the last 1500 -2500 years we have heavily deviated from our principals as followed above which resulted in our painful degradation ultimately lead to slavery rule by foreigner on us.

We need to teach our future generation the same principals for making them like Ram so that Dharam is established again across the world and all evil are eliminated and makes our country once again the Leader in the world.

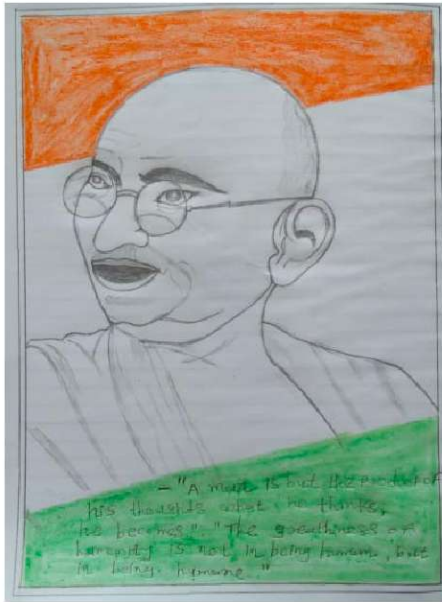

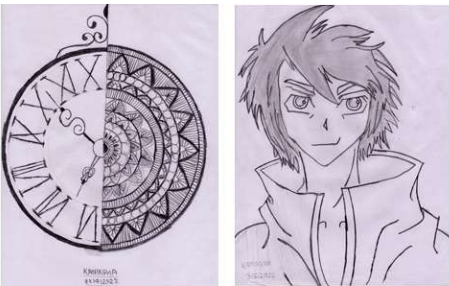

Key features of the policy are as under

Q1. Who is eligible under GPA?

Ans: All employees on the roll of PIL.

Q2. What is the sum insured under GPA?

Ans: Under GPA, sum insured amount is employee wise.

- Minimum is 4,80,000 and maximum is 10,00,000/-

Q3. Is claim intimation mandatory?

Ans: Yes, claim should be intimated within 24 hours.

Q4. What are the coverage under GPA policy?

Ans: 1. Accidental benefits like death / permanent or partial or temporary total disability

2. Accidental Hospitalization expenses are cover (On Duty + Off Duty)

3. Ambulance Charges up to Rs:1000/- Per Person)

Q5. What are the benefits under GPA policy?

Ans Benefits are -

- Coverage from day 01 ,
- OPD Charges Upto Rs.25,000/- or Actual which ever is lower ,
- Accidental Medical Extension (Only Hospitalisation) ,Upto Rs.50,000/- or Actual Which ever is less ,
- In case of accidental death total sum assured will be payable

Q6.Which are the exclusion from GPA?

Ans: Compensation under more than one of the benefits like Permanent Total Disability + Permanent Partial Disability + Temporary Total Disability in respect of same period of disablement .

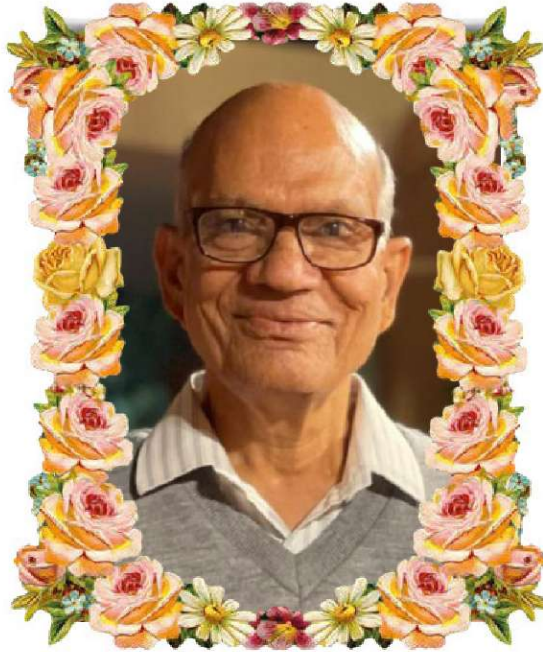

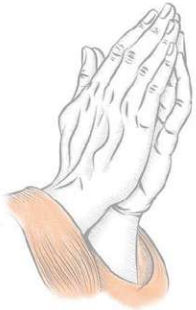
